Know the number of students and parent volunteers

Kindergarten to Grade 6 require a ratio of 1 adult chaperone to every 5 students. Grades 7 and up require a ratio of 1 adult chaperone to every 10 students. Extra adults are subject to additional fees.

Please arrange transportation and keep in mind weather and road conditions.

Bookings are currently for the 2018/19 school year and are available Tuesday through Thursdays. Book early! Spots fill up fast. Note: we book up quickly in popular months (April - June) please have several date options in mind when you fill out the booking request form.

Please have ready:

- 1. Emailed Program Request Form
- 2. VISA or MasterCard required for your deposit
- 3. School name
- 4. Mailing address, phone number and fax number
- 5. Email address
- 6. Grade level and number of students, teacher and parent volunteers
- 7. Program choices (first and second choice), date and time

We will confirm your registration by email upon receipt of the non-refundable deposit.



Field Trip Policies

1. Late Arrival

- Late arrival for programs and tours will result in parts of the program being omitted.
- Late arrivals for theatre shows will not be allowed entry once the show has started.
- If a school is late, all items on the booking are still the responsibility of that school.

2. Confirmation of Your Booking

- Teachers will be emailed a confirmation upon payment of deposit. Please review your booking to ensure all the details are correct. It is the teacher's responsibility to contact us immediately if there is a concern or change in plan.
- Maximum number of students will be required upon booking. Program space is limited.
- Please let Visitor Services know upon booking if you require an invoice.

3. Deposit Policy

- A 50% non-refundable deposit is required to hold your program date and time. Our Visitor Services Coordinator will contact you for the deposit to confirm the booking.
- Payment can be made by credit card or school cheque, payable to: River of Death and Discovery Dinosaur Museum Society.
- In the event of a cancellation please contact our Visitor Services Coordinator.
- PJCDM is a popular tourist destination and the school programs could often be unavailable due
 to private bookings. The deposit ensures fairness for schools and allows us to keep your costs
 down.

4. Cancellation Policy

- If a program is cancelled and is NOT rescheduled within the same school year, the non-refundable 50% deposit will be forfeited.
- In cases of cancellation due to inclement weather: (1) If the booking is rescheduled during the same school year, no charges are incurred; (2) If the booking is not rescheduled, the non-refundable 50% deposit will be forfeited.

5. School Group Admission Policy

A group of students and their supervisors shall be considered a school group if they are
participating in a field trip organized through: (1) An institution accredited by Alberta
Education (or equivalent from another province or country); (2) An organization licensed by
Alberta Social Services for supervised child care, (3) Home schooling.

6. School Group Supervision Policy

- Required chaperones including teachers:
 - Kindergarten Grade 6 requires 1 chaperone per 5 students
 - o Grade 7 and up requires 1 chaperone per 10 students



- Teachers are admitted free for building admission and programs.
- Chaperones or teachers over the required ratio will be charged \$11.00 per adult.
- Teachers and chaperones are responsible for the behavior of their group and are required to supervise and stay with students at all times during their visit.

7. School Group Admission Fees

- School group admission fees are as published and are subject to change without notice.
- No passes, coupons or discounts are accepted with school group bookings.
- Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum Membership rate is not valid on school program fees.

8. Day of Field Trip

- Arrive 15 minutes before your program, this allows you to organize your class and for students to use the washroom facilities.
- Check in at Visitor Services upon arrival. The remainder of the balance is to be paid in full on the day of your field trip in the form of school/division cheque or credit card.
- Have a copy of your booking confirmation.
- Supervise your group at all times and know where to meet for your scheduled activities.
- There are cubbies available for outerwear and backpacks. Please place any shoes on the floor below the cubbies.

9. Exhibit Galleries

Our gallery is very interactive with several hands on exhibits; school groups and public visitors
are requested to handle all exhibits and education materials in a respectful manner. Any
damage incurred from misuse will be the responsibility of the school.

First Aid

Parking
